Seven years ago, Chris Evans had a dream: to get children excited about reading and writing. All children, no matter what their ability. 500 Words is now one of the most successful story-writing competitions for children in the world. Nearly half a million pupils have written a story; that is over 277 million words!

It's very simple. Your children write an original story on any subject or theme in 500 Words or fewer and [submit it online](#). If they win, their story will be read live on the radio by a superstar celebrity...like Sir Kenneth Branagh, Jeremy Irons, Hugh Bonneville or Sherlock himself - Benedict Cumberbatch. Each year, 10 million Radio 2 listeners hear, read and love these stories.

This year the final will be held in the Tower of London.

The competition runs from the 16th January 2016 to the 23rd February 2017, and is open to children from 5 years to 13 years old.

If your child is interested, Mrs Allcock, (a 500 Word judge), will be holding Thursday lunchtime workshops to support and inspire any pupil who wishes to take part.

Music at Holy Trinity

Music continues to go from strength to strength at Holy Trinity. This term our Key Stage 2 Choir has grown even larger, and now consists of over forty enthusiastic singers. We are busy rehearsing for the Chipping Norton Music Festival on March 4th when we will be entering the Junior Choirs' Competition. In assembly this morning, the children were treated to an a cappella version of "When I'm Gone." It was a joy to listen to! Our Key Stage 1 Choir are also singing like angels, and under Mrs Jenkins watchful eye, they too are preparing for the Chipping Norton Music Festival on Saturday 4th March. (Further details will follow once a programme has been agreed).

Instrument learning: all our children in Year 2 and Year 5 are given the opportunity to learn a musical instrument. Our Year 2 children learn the recorder with many continuing with a beginners or advanced recorder club run by Mrs Hills and Mrs Jenkins. Our Year 5 children learn to play a brass instrument during their weekly instrumental lessons. We run individual piano and woodwind lessons and this is open to all children in Key Stage 2. Please enquire at the school office if you would like further details.

Following a suggestion from our Junior Leadership Team, we are also now offering drumming lessons to children in Key Stage 2. Lessons will be held on a Tuesday and led by drumming teacher Nick Ward. If you wish to enrol your child please visit: www.worldbeatsmusic.co.uk. All children will need to enrol before *Monday 23rd January*. My long-term aim is that we will eventually be able to form a HT rock band – watch this space!

Years 3 and 4 are preparing to deliver an all singing and dancing spectacle - an Easter performance called 'Resurrection Rock' which will be performed on 4th April at 6:00pm. Further details to follow.

If you would like to introduce your child to the world of classical music, the Oxford Philharmonic Orchestra are performing FUNomusica Family Concerts for children aged 4-8, and aged 8-12, on Sunday 5th February in Oxford Town Hall.
